## WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

- Shoe box
- Paint (whatever colors you want)
- Playdough or clay
- Sticky tape or glue

- Sticks
- Leaves
- Stones or rocks
- Scissors

## STEPS:

- 1. Paint your shoe box (you might want to paint a bush scene)
- 2. Shape your humpy and use sticky tape to join
- 3. Use sticky tape or glue to add the leaves or bark to your humpy (you can use both)
- 4. Make or decorate a scene using material from outside (dirt, stones, rocks, sticks, grass or leaves)
